Supply Chain and Further Steps

We take our responsibilities as a corporate citizen seriously and hold ourselves to exacting standards in this regard. We are committed to ensuring that all forms of modern slavery, including forced labor and human trafficking, are excluded from our supply chain. As a freight forwarded and logistics service provider, our supply chain consists primarily of sub-tier service providers and consultants, including suppliers in the following areas:

- Air freight
- Ocean freight
- Trucking
- Cargo Aircraft Chartering
- Multimodal
- Courier service
- Passenger air charter
- Packing and crating
- Insurance providers
- Warehousing and installation
- Business process services

We require our suppliers, through our contracts and other business documentation, to adhere to all applicable legal requirements and best industry practices. Our subcontracting and sourcing functions operate in highly regulated logistics environments governed both by domestic laws and regulations as well as international treaties and conventions. Our in-house agents perform due diligence on our suppliers including onsite work and visits where necessary.

Going forward, we are assessing the incorporation of the requirements of a formal code of conduct into our supplier business documentation as well as revisions to our existing requirements to further reflect modern slavery legislation and best practices.
